SHAKESPEARE FOR YOUNG ACTORS - MACBETH: Evil. ambition, murder, ghosts and witches! This summer our class will be a fully-staged production of Macbeth, directed by Paul Signist over a two week period. Because of the tremendous success of last summer's production of The Tempest, this summer we invite you to join us for one of the most famous plays ever written. Paul will create an abridged edition to be fully staged and given a public presentation on the last day of class. Students will be expected to have their lines and blocking memorized. Shakespeare is FUN and COOL and no one should ever be afraid of him. Come join us for this unique, exciting opportunity for young actors, whether you've had Paul's Shakespeare class before or are exploring Shakespeare for the first time. HMT endorses color blind and gender blind casting. Ages 11-18 (Students under 11 are welcome if they've had an HMT Shakespeare class in the past)

SCENES FROM GREAT AMERICAN PLAYS: This class was so successful last year that we're offering it again this summer with the addition of some great new scenes. Young actors will have the chance to explore and perform scenes from several classic American plays. Returning instructor Paul Sigrist will be directing the scenes, coaching students in acting technique and giving them the tools an actor needs to create a character. It's an excellent opportunity for the serious young performer who wants to learn more about the craft of acting. Students will be expected to memorize their scenes and blocking. Both new and returning students are welcome.

SCENES FROM GREAT BRITISH PLAYS: Some of the world's greatest playwrights have come from Great Britain; of course we all know about Shakespeare (1564-1612) but much more recently noted British playwrights such as Oscar Wilde, Harold Pinter, Dylan Thomas, W. S. Gilbert, Noel Coward, George Bernard Shaw, J. M. Barrie, Alan Ayckbourn, J. B. Priestly and others have achieved true greatness as well. After last year's success with the "Great American Plays" summer class, this summer we are also offering this class to examine and perform scenes from British plays chosen from among the work of those important writers from England, Ireland, Wales and Scotland. Young actors will have the opportunity to explore and perform these scenes with instructor Paul Sigrist directing and coaching students in acting technique and performance style. Students will be expected to memorize their scenes and blocking. This class will be a great chance for a young actor to explore this classic repertory of plays and learn about how to be a better actor onstage at the same time. Ages 8-18

New Class for Ages 14 and Up!

STAGE AND FILM ACTING TECHNIQUE LAB: HMT presents a brand new class for theater-savvy adults and serious older student actors. This class will consist of an examination of the range of acting styles expected in the professional performing world, such as stage vs. film styles, commercial/sitcom vs. legit drama styles, as well as the exploration of practical acting tools (internal monologue, backstory, motivation). The class will use scene study and monologue work with possible opportunities for some directing as well. There will be an emphasis on learning how to critique a performance for its successful and less successful components in a constructive manner. Based on his own personal experience as a professional actor in New York as well as his cumulative education from attending dozens of classes taught by leading NYC casting directors and talent agents, Paul will convey to the participants what is expected of a professional-level stage/film actor in New York, what gets an actor hired (or not) and useful ways to improve as an actor. **Ages 14 - Adult**

PAUL SIGRIST is a New York-based actor, singer and director equally at home in theater, television and film. He is a member of the performing unions SAG-AFTRA and AEA. He spent 19 consecutive seasons with the professional repertory company The New York Gilbert and Sullivan Players in Off-Broadway productions in New York and on tour throughout the U.S., Canada and England, as well as performed with many other organizations. He was a member of a seven-actor cast nominated for a Drama Desk Award for the Vortex Theater's revival of H.M. S. Pinafore. He works as an actor for the Columbia University Graduate Film Program, appearing in class scenes and short films directed by the graduate directing students. In the capital district, he directed and choreographed a popular revival of Trial by Jury for Hubbard Hall Opera in 2013, has been a guest instructor and director of Shakespeare annually for HMT's summer programs since 2011 and co-directed and choreographed a series of Gilbert and Sullivan operettas for the former Opera

Saratoga Summer Intensive. On television, he frequently appears on Saturday Night Live as an additional actor in sketches and pretapes, has appeared on The Americans, Late Night with Jimmy Fallon, Law and Order: SVU, and The Electric Company among many others. He portrayed real-life 1980s Grateful Dead keyboardist Brent Mydland in the feature film The Music Never Stopped. www.paulsigrist.com
