

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## **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

When I first revisited 1776, I was struck not only by its rich tapestry of characters and historical detail, but by its deep humanity. This is not a musical of marble statues and pristine ideals, it is a story of real, flawed people grappling with impossible decisions during a time of unimaginable uncertainty. It is loud and funny, contentious and heartbreaking. And, like any democracy, it is messy.

What sets 1776 apart is its willingness to show us the cost of freedom, not just the political cost, but the personal one. These delegates argued, compromised, and in some cases, remained silent on issues that would haunt the country for centuries to come. And yet, from all of that, a declaration was born.

This production has been a labor of love, and I'm incredibly proud of this cast and crew for embracing the complexity, the contradictions, and the heart of this show. They have given life and nuance to figures many of us have only seen in textbooks. They've made them real.

As we present this story nearly 250 years after the signing of the Declaration of Independence, I invite you to reflect on what it means to pursue a more perfect union and the courage it still takes to sign your name to something bigger than yourself.

Thank you for joining us on this journey back to the birth of our nation.
